We want Elmbridge to be a place where people can go about their everyday lives, day or night, confident in the knowledge that this is a place where people treat each other fairly and with respect, and they are safe from harm or the effects of crime and disorder.

Priorities:

To work in partnership to address causes of offending and reduce crime and anti-social-behaviour.

To ensure that all victims in the Borough are given the appropriate level of support feel safe and to tackle issues that may have emerged as a result of being a victim of crime or anti-social behaviour.

To ensure that residents are aware of the work carried out by the Community Safety Partnership and through this, to enhance the feeling of safety and public confidence.

Governance:

This plan will be governed by the Community Safety Partnership. This plan will steer the strategic-level work of the Partnership and it will be most relevant to this level. An Overview and Scrutiny Working Group will undertake an annual review of the Partnership.

Monitoring and Evaluation:

Success will be demonstrated by: rate of proven re-offending; reports of ASB; repeat victim referrals; reduction in serious acquisitive crime; alcohol attributable recorded crimes; reduced risk to victim's; reduction in high harm offences and increased confidence.

Resources:

The Plan will be supported by the Community Safety budget of the council and work done by partner agencies.
