

Where does my council tax go?

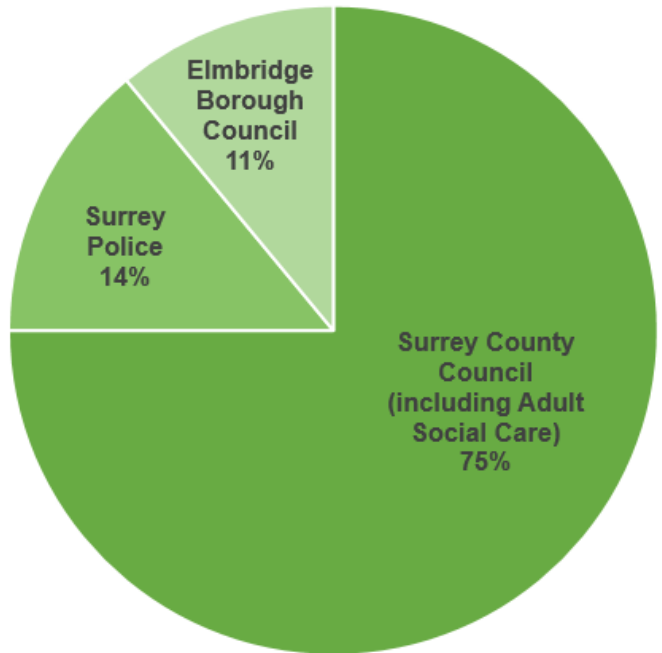
Your council tax is collected by Elmbridge Borough Council.

The majority goes to Surrey County Council. The remainder is split between Surrey Police and Elmbridge Borough Council*

Each of these organisations provides different services and charge different amounts.

This year your total council tax has increased by 2.87%

* Residents living in Claygate pay slightly more as a contribution to Claygate Parish Council.

How has my bill changed this year?

Example breakdown for a property in band D

	£ Increase	£ Charge for 2021/22
Surrey County Council General Expenditure	£30.07	£1,410.07
Surrey County Council Adult Social Care Precept	£7.55	£139.01
Surrey Police	£15.00	£285.57
Elmbridge Borough Council	£5.00	£231.30
Total:	£57.62	£2,065.95

Surrey County Council's general expenditure and Adult Social Care % increase shown on your bill is calculated using the total of both charges last year. This total has increased by 1.99% for Surrey County Council general expenditure and 0.5% for Adult Social Care expenditure. Surrey County Council's combined increase is 2.49%. By law the breakdown of this overall increase is shown to one decimal place on your bill against each expenditure, being 2.0% and 0.5%.

The Adult Social Care part of Surrey County Council's overall increase can only be used to fund adult social care services.
