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Introduction

Background to Annual Infrastructure Funding Statement

The 'Community Infrastructure Levy Regulations 2010 (as amended)' amendment PART 10A requirement 121A, which came into force in September 2019, sets out the new reporting requirements for Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) and planning obligations in relation to the previous financial year ("the reported year"). The annual infrastructure funding statement must be published by 31st December.

As per requirement 121A, the Annual infrastructure funding statements should include:

- Infrastructure list
- CIL report
- Section 106 report

The report requirements are set out in 'Schedule 2 Regulation 121A - Matters to be included in the annual infrastructure funding statement' of the regulations.

The following statement sets out these details for Elmbridge Borough Council for the reporting year 2021 – 2022 (1 April 2021 – 31 March 2022).

Infrastructure list

What is CIL and how is it allocated

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) allows the council to raise funds from some forms of new development to help fund the infrastructure needed to mitigate the impacts of new development. CIL funds are used for either local infrastructure or infrastructure of wider strategic benefit to the borough.

The council has been collecting CIL since the CIL Charging Schedule came into effect on 1 April 2013. The council is using CIL in conjunction with infrastructure providers to deliver improvements borough-wide.

An initial 5% of CIL funds collected is retained by the council for administration purposes and 15% of the funds are allocated in local areas to infrastructure projects which are required in the communities where development took place. The remaining CIL funds are allocated towards strategic borough-wide infrastructure:

• 88% of CIL is allocated through the Strategic Priority Programme (SPP) for strategic borough-wide infrastructure that will be required to bring forward development and enable future growth; and

• 12% of CIL is ringfenced for maintenance purposes as agreed and approved through the Council's capital application programme.

All CIL funding awards are done through a competitive bid and review process. The local CIL funds are allocated through the Local Spending Boards (consisting of Ward Councillors for the area), except in the case of Claygate where the local CIL funds are passed to the Parish Council to allocate as per the regulations. The strategic CIL funds are allocated through the Strategic Priority Programme (SPP).

Strategic Priority Programme: Infrastructure list

Below is a statement of the infrastructure projects or types of infrastructure which the Council intends will be, or may be, wholly or partly funded by the strategic proportion of the CIL. These are borough-wide infrastructure projects required to enable and support the future growth of the borough from new development.
