Damp and Mould Action Plan September 2023

Introduction

The Government has reported that a third of privately rented homes do not meet the government's Decent Homes Standard. Therefore, we can extrapolate that there is a probability that a proportion of the private-rented sector properties in Elmbridge will suffer from issues surrounding damp and mould within the home.

We have identified three key objectives to help us to drive up standards in the private-rented sector in Elmbridge. These points will help us to address damp and mould issues in privately rented properties within the borough, and the table below shows our action plan which we will use to implement these intentions.

Raising awareness

We will ensure that all Officers who carry out home visits in privately rented properties have sufficient training to identify damp and mould. This will allow them to report the information to the private sector housing team to appropriate action. We will investigate complaints of damp and mould using the housing health and safety rating system (HHSRS), to assess the health and safety risk to occupants in privately rented properties.	Ongoing	Private sector housing team	Ongoing
We will explore possible funding for tenants and/or landlords to carry out works to address damp and mould in privately rented properties. Private tenants with property repairs responsibilities may be eligible to receive financial assistance from the council. Eligibility requirements and terms and conditions apply.
